The Second Morrill Act of 1890 stands as a defining milestone in the history of American higher education. SPEAKER

NATASHA WILLIAMS

Broadway Performer and N.C. A&T Alumna



NaTasha Yvette Williams '92 is a Grammy Award-winning and Tony Award-nominated Broadway performer whose artistry has made her one of the most celebrated voices of her generation. A proud graduate of North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University (BFA) and Michigan State University (MFA), she has built a career that spans Broadway, television, film and international stages.

On Broadway, Williams has delivered powerhouse performances in *Some Like It Hot*, *The Color Purple* (original company), *Chicago*, *Waitress* and *A Night with Janis Joplin*. She stars in the blockbuster musical *Wicked*, where she brings depth and brilliance to the role of Madame Morrible. Beyond Broadway, her television credits include *FBI*, *Harlem*, *Grey's Anatomy*, *NOS4A2* and *Godfather of Harlem*. Her film work includes *Alice* and *Sweet Little Lies*.

Williams' impact extends beyond performance. A woman of faith and vision, she is a founding member of Black Theater United, an advocacy organization dedicated to supporting and uplifting Black artists. She is also a mentor and educator, committed to nurturing the next generation of storytellers and encouraging them to pursue their dreams with courage and authenticity. Williams is producing her first feature film, *Beyond the*

Diamond, and creating *Good Moments*, *Good Forever*, a video series celebrating the people, places and experiences that inspire lasting impact.

Williams received the 2021 N.C. A&T Alumni Achievement Award from the College of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences in recognition of her outstanding accomplishments, emphasizing her significant contributions to both the arts and her alma mater.

In addition to her artistic achievements, Williams is a devoted wife, mother and advocate who embodies the principle of "lifting as you climb." Her life and career stand as proof that when purpose and passion align, they create a legacy that opens doors for others.

HISTORY

NORTH CAROLINA AGRICULTURAL AND TECHNICAL STATE UNIVERSITY

Established in 1891 under the Second Morrill Act of 1890, North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University is a land-grant, doctoral, high research activity, historically Black university. The Second Morrill Act expanded the nation's system of land-grant institutions to provide for colleges in states where segregation denied Black students access to land-grant institutions established by the First Morrill Act (1862).

Throughout its 134-year history, North Carolina A&T has maintained a strong commitment to excellence in academics, research and service, in the best land-grant tradition. Land grants have traditionally been known as "the people's colleges," as they broke down societal barriers that previously had limited higher education mostly to elite white students. North Carolina A&T is an outstanding example of land-grant excellence.

With an enrollment of 15,275 students, North Carolina A&T in 2025 is the nation's largest public historically Black university or HBCU for the 12th consecutive year. An institution of choice for high-achieving learners and accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges, North Carolina A&T enrolls students from all 50 states and more than 100 foreign nations.

The university's academic programs are organized across nine colleges and two schools: the College of Agriculture and Environmental Sciences; the College of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences; the Willie A. Deese College of Business and Economics; the College of Education; the College of Engineering; the John R. and Kathy R. Hairston College of Health and Human Sciences; the College of Science and Technology; the Honors College; The Graduate College; the Joint School of Nanoscience and Nanoengineering; and the School of Nursing.

North Carolina A&T is widely recognized for its strengths in science, technology, engineering and mathematics, as well as the liberal arts and humanities and a growing array of professional programs. North Carolina A&T produces more Black STEM graduates than any other U.S. college or university, as well as more Black engineers and agricultural scientists. The university ranks among the nation's top 10 producers of Black graduates in 12 more disciplines, as well as in "all disciplines combined."

North Carolina A&T has developed significantly as research university over the past 20 years and now exceeds criteria for the Carnegie Classifications' R1 designation. University faculty have significantly surpassed both \$50 million in research expenditures and 70 doctoral graduates per year and have landed \$350 million in total research contracts and grants for the past three fiscal years.

North Carolina A&T is one of the UNC System's top three research institutions, alongside Chapel Hill and North Carolina State, in annual contract and grant awards. Its wide-ranging portfolio of research centers, institutes and initiatives includes a \$24-million clean energy training project, major National Institutes of Health initiatives in Alzheimer's disease studies and membership in two federally funded regional semiconductor research hubs at the University of Southern California and North Carolina State. The university's leadership in autonomous vehicle research and nanoscience studies are highly regarded nationally.

Students join the university's 75,000 alumni upon graduation, including numerous nationally prominent Aggies. The Rev. Jesse L. Jackson Sr. '63 was America's first major Black presidential candidate and continues to be a leader in the civil rights movement. The Hon.

Henry E. Frye '53 was the first Black N.C. Supreme Court Chief Justice, while the Hon. Elreta Alexander-Ralston '37 was both the first woman to practice law in North Carolina and its first elected judge. Michael S. Regan '98, served as U.S. EPA administrator for the entire of the Joe Biden presidency. The late Ronald McNair '71 was one of NASA's first Black astronauts before perishing in the 1986 Challenger space shuttle tragedy.

Alma S. Adams '69, '72, Edolphus W. Towns '56, Jesse Jackson Jr. '87, Jonathan Jackson and Jake Wheatley '56 have all served in the U.S. House of Representatives. The late Alvin A. "Al" Attles Jr. '60, was an NBA player and later one of the league's first Black head coaches, while NFL star Elvin Bethea '68 was named to the Pro Football Hall of Fame. Brig. Gen. Clara Adams-Ender '61 led the U.S Army Nurse Corps. And Ezell Blair Jr. (Jibreel Khazan) '63, the late Joseph A. McNeil '63, the late Franklin E. McCain Sr. '63 and the late David Richmond '10 (degree awarded posthumously) comprised the A&T Four; together, they changed the trajectory of the U.S. civil rights movement with a lunch-counter sit-in that became the catalyst for 55 similar sit-ins across 13 states.

COSTUME

THE ACADEMIC COSTUME

The academic costume worn today derived from practices originating in the Middle Ages. When European universities were taking form in the 12th and 13th centuries, the scholars were usually clerics as well, and consequently they adopted costumes similar to those of their monastic orders. Cold halls and drafty buildings made caps and floor length gowns with attached hoods a necessity for warmth. Probably because of the costumes' religious heritage, they remained largely drab until the universities gradually began to pass from the control of the church, whereupon some aspects of the costumes took on brighter hues. Old prints reveal a strong similarity between the regalia worn in early universities and the academic costume worn today.

In light of the nation's strong English heritage, academic costume has been in use in the United States since colonial times. To establish a standard of uniformity with regard to the practice, an intercollegiate commission was formed, which prepared a code for caps, gowns and hoods that has been adopted by all universities. Originally round, the shape of the cap is now the more familiar mortarboard square — a shape that resembles a scholar's book. Legend has it that the privilege of wearing a cap was the initial right of a freed Roman slave. The flowing gown has become symbolic of the democracy of scholarship for it covers any dress, which might indicate rank or social strata. The hood not only indicates the type of degree, but also is lined with the official colors of the university from which the degree was obtained.

THE GOWN

BACHELOR – Blue, full cut with long pointed sleeves.

MASTER – Black, long or short sleeves with arc-shaped panel extended for each sleeve.

DOCTOR – Black, with velvet panels on front of gown and three velvet bars on each sleeve. Color of the velvet may be black or distinctive of the field of study.

THE HOOD

BACHELOR – Three feet in length with a two-inch wide velvet.

MASTER – Three and one-half feet in length with a three-inch wide velvet.

DOCTOR – Four feet in length with a five-inch wide velvet and panel at the sides. The lining of the hoods, which is folded out, bears the official colors of the institution from which the degree was received. The color of the velvet is Ph.D. blue.

Candidates for doctoral degrees at North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University wear gowns fastened at the neck, hoods draped down the back and black mortarboards with a gold tassel.

These graduates are wearing honor cords of gold.

MAGNA CUM LAUDE (With High Honor)

These graduates are wearing honor cords of blue.

SUMMA CUM LAUDE (With Highest Honor)

Graduates with an overall grade point average of 3.75-4.00.
These graduates are wearing honor stoles.

UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES VETERANS

MACE

The mace, a ceremonial academic symbol with a rich history dating back to ancient Rome, is a traditional element of most university and college commencement ceremonies, convocations and other prominent academic events throughout each school year. Typically three to four feet long with stylized, often ornate design details and weighing as much as 20 pounds, maces have an imposing presence and are meant to represent authority and the importance of higher education.

North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University recently retired a 34-year-old mace gifted to the university by the graduating class of 1961. In its place is a beautiful new mace created to better represent the current and evolving state of North Carolina A&T as an esteemed and exponential doctoral research land-grant HBCU that leads the nation in education and graduation of Black undergraduate and graduate students.

Designed and produced by Medalcraft Mint, a nationally leading producer of academic, military and athletic medallions, awards, challenge coins, shadow boxes and more, in collaboration with the A&T Office of Special Events and Projects, the new mace is a 42-inch scepter made of brass and walnut with a cordovan stain.

At the top of the mace are two North Carolina A&T official seals represented in 4-inch brass medallions against the front and back of a circular walnut panel. Below that is a four-sided, lantern-style head, with the seals of the State of North Carolina and the University of North Carolina System represented on alternating sides.

The top and head rest atop a walnut staff with three brass bands in intervals down its length, comprising the mace in entirety. When not in use, the mace rests for display and storage purposes on a walnut stand emblazoned with a 3-inch brass North Carolina A&T seal.

“While a mace uses symbolism and materials that convey history, mission and tradition, the new mace brings that depiction into a current and specific context,” said Interim Provost and Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs Catherine Edmonds. “North Carolina A&T has experienced so much change over the past 20 years as it has evolved as a land-grant research university and grown in national impact. The new mace is an important symbol of that progress and a visual indication of what the history holds for our university.”

In ancient times, maces honored nobility and war heroes. Later used in the courts of England, they were symbols of authority. Today in Western culture, maces are most often associated with academic and governmental processions. In academic use, maces are symbols of the college/university as a body of scholars within its own legally constituted authority.

The Faculty Senate president bears the mace in all formal academic processions. In A&T commencement ceremonies, the mace will be carried at the front of the procession of platform committee members to the commencement stage and in the recessional, as the platform committee exits the coliseum.
